

LISTING POSTGRADUATE COURSES IN THE UCAS 'UNDERGRADUATE' SCHEME

UCAS has an agreement with providers for the listing of a number of full-time postgraduate courses in the UCAS UG scheme.

These are currently postgraduate or pre-registration courses in:

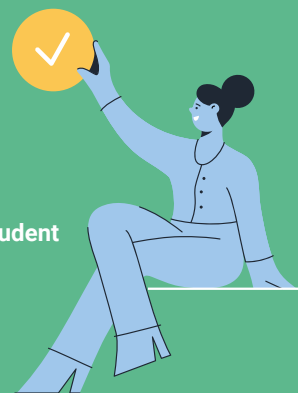
- > Midwifery
- > Social Work
- > Nursing and most recently
- > Physician Associate Studies

Scottish and Welsh postgraduate teacher training qualifications should also be listed.



By listing your course in the UCAS UG scheme this means that:

- > Applicants are limited to making up to **5 choices** on their application, they will be able to choose a **firm and insurance offer**
- > The January **Equal Consideration Deadline** will apply (all applications received before this date will receive equal and fair consideration)
- > Applicants will have to pay an **application fee**
- > Providers will have to pay a **capitation fee per placed student**
- > Providers have to **recruit all students through the scheme for these courses**
- > Your courses will be listed in the undergraduate course listings in Search and discover tools
